### A THRIVING DUAL-LANGUAGE PROGRAM

Research shows that bilingual children who are educated in their second language outperform students who speak and learn only in their native language. Students at Sequoyah go beyond learning another language to learn about other cultures. Students learn to read first in their dominant language, then they spend equal amounts of time building literacy in English and Spanish. Math is taught in English, while science and social studies are taught in Spanish. Students build fluency in both languages through their daily interactions with peers and teachers.

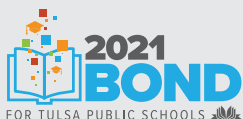
All clubs and programs have been paused as we monitor COVID-19 conditions and safety protocols.
